Kurt Baird, the construction manager, said that Didion has 22 employees on site, and he may add eight more people when the weather breaks. Agra Industries of

weather breaks. Agra Industries of Merrill is the general contractor on the project, and Didion's construction department sub-contracts work on the project.

"It's a very exciting company to work for," said Baird, who has been with Didion since January, 2002 and lives in Fox Lake.

To date, approximately 2,500 yards of concrete have been poured, with 48

tons of rebar. The recent cold snap slowed construction down, Baird said, because the ability to pour concrete is very, very hard. Employees were

offered the choice of whether to work or not during the sub-zero weather.

The ethanol plant will use a by-product created when Didion Milling grinds corn. Baird said


that the parts of the corn left over in the grinding process are full of starch and sugar, ideal for making ethanol. Baird has worked on five other ethanol plants in his career.

"This will probably be one of the first ethanol plants that has built concrete buildings like we have," said Baird. "It's unique."

Didion hopes to have the ethanol plant, designed by Delta T, up and running by late December.
