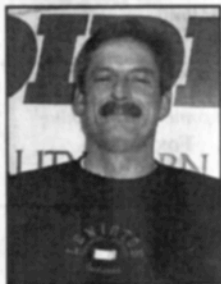


Didion Ethanol Milling
