**Cambria Village Board Of Trustees Votes To Deny Didion Permit**

Cambria, WI, June 4th, 2003

Agreeing with an earlier Cambria Planning Commission recommendation, the Cambria Village Board of Trustees voted 5 to 2 early Monday evening to reject Didion Milling's application for a zoning permit. Didion Milling sought the permit in order to expand their operation in Cambria to include an ethanol manufacturing facility.

**• Chief among reasons cited for denying the zoning permit:**

1) Didion hasn't supplied the village with the requested hydrogeological test data regarding a proposed high capacity well.

2) The Wisconsin DNR denied Didion Milling's request to permit two high capacity wells with a total capacity of 1000 gallons per minute.

3) Nearly 60% of voters in Cambria voted against Didion's proposed expansion.

**• Cambrians For Thoughtful Development (CTD) questioned the appropriateness of Didion's expansion plans from the beginning. The vote on Monday night is the culmination of many months hard work by a dedicated group of Cambria citizens. As John Mueller, a CTD member puts it:**

"I'm delighted to rediscover the idea that people can make a difference in their communities. I'd begun to think that idea was as outmoded as believing in industry, any type of industry, as the sole economic savior for small towns. Nothing could be further from the truth. People can bring about change and CTD will now set out to explore the many ways to keep our village vital and alive."
