

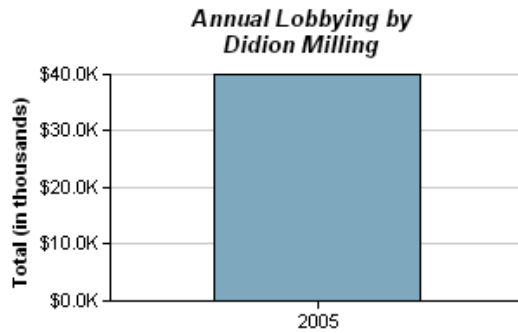


**DIDION MILLING
